The NHS Long Term Plan is drawn up by frontline staff, patients groups, and national experts to be ambitious but realistic.

Engagement Hub Update – No training between Jan – Jun 2019

As part of our ongoing evaluation of the training programme we have decided to pause our delivery of a scheduled training calendar and review our provision. There are several reasons for this, including; poor attendance and high cancellation rates (we've cancelled more sessions than ran over the last five months) as well as ongoing discussions with our partner organisations about the need to nail down processes and ways of working going forward.

We're going to use the 'fallow' six month period to evaluate the engagement hub work and see what it is going to look like with everything kicking back into gear by July 2019. As discussed in our meeting on **7 November**, we will be looking to put on a specific training session for CCG Volunteers on the 'Being an effective health volunteer' training and 'Knowing your community' training. More details on those dates will be confirmed as soon as possible. **We will still be running the patient reader group and the PPG Network Support Group (the next of which is on 31st January 2019, 9:30am – 12:30pm at the Old Fire Station, LS9 6NL).**

Other training opportunities – NHS England PPV Partners Training

Dates: 16-17 January 2019 (Manchester), 29-30 January 2019 (London)

What is it? Two days of interactive and fun classroom-based learning with a focus on influencing change, and developing skills and confidence to make the most of the Patient and Public Voice (PPV) partner role.

Who is it for? For PPV partners involved in NHS England or supporting transformation programmes (STP, ICS, etc.) on a regular basis. It is aimed at those working to support major change but who are less experienced in their role. There are also limited places for staff who support PPV roles.

Key topics include: 'Understanding health and social care', 'PPV partner roles and responsibilities', 'partnership and influence' and 'putting it all into practice'.

Travel expenses and overnight accommodation will be provided based on individual need. **Apply using this application:**
