We're asking all our volunteers to complete a short bio that we can use on the website. You can find the bio here:



Title	Personal Health Budgets – 117 Aftercare
<p>Project Summary</p>	<p>There is a government mandate to roll out the implementation of personal health budgets (PHBs) to a number of different areas of care. An existing one is Personal Wheelchair Budgets, where patients are able to select the wheelchair they need to address their specific needs. This is purchased and arranged by the provider to ensure they get the right chair (as opposed to being given a generic one that isn't suitable).</p> <p>The next area that this is focusing on is 117 Aftercare for patients under a section 117 treatment order of the mental health act. The PHB will allow patients to identify care, interventions or equipment that will enable them to maintain and achieve their recovery goals.</p> <p>We're currently looking for one or two CCG Volunteers to be involved in decision making around the process and implementation of 117 PHBs in Leeds. There are a number of opportunities to get involved including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Sitting on the PHB steering group and offering challenge where appropriate. • Networking with different organisations, including voluntary sector. • Possibility to network on a West Yorkshire and Harrogate wide level. • To be involved in the NHS England co-production network. • Help develop a co-produced action plan. <p>Please note you're not expected to do all of the above, these are the opportunities this role provides.</p> <p>We will ask for you to meet with the lead commissioner for an introduction to the subject.</p>

Urgent Treatment Centres (21.01.19 – 15.04.19) - **UPDATE**

Engagement Hub Update – No training between Jan – Jun 2019

As part of our ongoing evaluation of the training programme we have decided to pause our delivery of a scheduled training calendar and review our provision. There are several reasons for this, including; poor attendance and high cancellation rates (we've cancelled more sessions than ran over the last five months) as well as ongoing discussions with our partner organisations about the need to nail down processes and ways of working going forward.
